Narrowing of Highway 41A Proposed Costs to SUD

In conjunction with plans to narrow Highway 41A, the Seawanee Utility District will be required to relocate sewer and water supply lines. At the May 19 meeting of the board of commissioners, SUD manager Ben Beavers reviewed the contract from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation (TDOT). TDOT regulations stipulate utilities must bear the cost of relocating service lines for road projects if there is not public money available for relocation. The cost for the sewer portion alone is \$400,000 in the worst-case scenario.

Board President Charlie Smith observed the developer typically paid for relocating utilities in development projects.

"The way the law is written, we will have to pay," said Beavers. "How we recover the money is up to us. There's nothing to say we can't pass a special development fee for the State Route 15 corridor." Note: State Route 15 is the state route name for Highway 41A.

The total cost for relocating sewer and water lines is half a million dollars if the plans are not changed. Beavers said there would be a utilities stakeholders meeting with TDOT next week. TDOT regulations stipulate service lines must cross the right-of-way at a 90-degree angle. All but one of SUD's service lines are very close to the 90-degree benchmark and some are in compliance. Beavers hopes for some relaxing of the standard.

"All the sewer lines were redone in the past 15-20 years," Beavers

said. "There's nothing wrong with them."

"The prudent thing is to wait until we get all the facts," Beavers said. "Once we get a final price, we need to get an official response from the University." The highway is being narrowed in conjunction with the University's Seawanee Village project.

The board also discussed SUD's revenue loss due to the University sending students home and canceling summer programs because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Beavers estimated the loss at \$35,000 per month and projected a \$200,000 loss for the year, a 28 percent decrease in anticipated revenue. "Once the students return, we'll be almost back to normal," Beavers said.

Looking for ways to mediate revenue loss, Beavers suggested stepping up SUD's efforts to cut back on unaccounted for water loss. Unaccounted for water loss is the difference between the amount of water treated at the plant and amount registered as sold on customer meters, meaning water SUD is not paid for. Recent testing revealed only one line leak as a possible source of water loss. The other possible cause of the unaccounted for loss is meter inaccuracy. Beavers will research the cost of meter testing to determine if testing to find the source of the unaccounted for loss will pay for itself in revenue increase.

In addition to revenue loss, SUD is experiencing another problem due to the pandemic:

Out of Control in the Time of Pandemic Workshop at St. Mary's Seawanee

Life feels out of control for many of us right now. The world's landscape has changed and we don't know how the future is going to unfold. Practicing Centering Prayer is one way to help us to better navigate this uncertain time.

The spiritual teachings and practices of both Centering Prayer and 12-Step Recovery are two of the most important contributions to the world's spiritual traditions.

In the first session on June 6, she will discuss how our need for control is a part of the human condition. The July session will be about our need for affection and esteem; the August session will be about our need for safety and security. Fr. Keating and Bill W often wrote about these three sets of human instincts, and how we can "overwork" them, making our lives chaotic, and out of balance. Prayer, meditation, and building kinship with others are solutions they embraced, and we will do the same in these sessions.

These hour-long workshops will be held via Zoom on 10 a.m. (CDT)/11 a.m. (Eastern), Saturday, June 6

Czarnecki Reports on the Virus Mitigation Efforts

A representative from the Tennessee Department of Health spoke to members and guests of the Monteagle-Seawanee Rotary Club this month about the state's response to COVID-19.

Glenn Czarnecki, regional director for the Southeast Region of the Tennessee Department of Health, spoke to the group about the department's efforts to mitigate the spread of the respiratory illness caused by the coronavirus.

Rotary president John Solomon said Czarnecki informed the group of some of the department's actions thus far, including their work to make testing more widely accessible and to begin reopening the state safely.

"Glenn works specifically with rural communities, and the fact that he is plugged into this area was a comfort," Solomon said. "Tennessee is among the top states as far as the percentage of the population that has been tested. It was just a good opportunity to talk about something that is on everyone's mind and to get an update directly from someone at the department."

Tennessee's first case of COVID-19 was reported on March 4, 2020. Over the subsequent weeks, case numbers increased rapidly. On April 2, Governor Lee signed his Safer at Home order to implement statewide restrictions on non-essential business and travel in order to "flatten the curve" and quickly slow the spread of disease.

In the weeks since, roughly five percent of the population in Tennessee has been tested for the coronavirus, which can often present asymptotically.

As of this reporting, state health workers have tested nearly 350,000 Tennessee residents, and of those thousands, there have been just over 18,000 positive cases. The Department of Health reported Tuesday that the total of recovered cases was rapidly approaching 11,000.

"The better we understand it, the quicker we can get back to a sense of normalcy," said Czarnecki.

Czarnecki added that disease monitoring, increased testing, increased health care capacity and an increase in available personal protective equipment are all responsible for slowing the spread of the virus in Tennessee.

If you are unable to appear at your polling place on Election Day or during the Early Voting period, you may request an absentee ballot.

Voter registration deadline is July 7.

Offices up for Election County General in Franklin County include winners from primaries, and School Board Members Districts 2, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8.

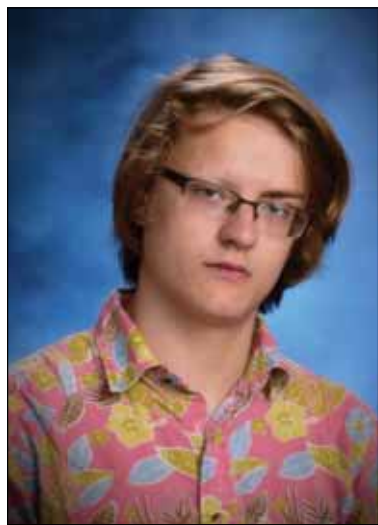

increased flushing of disposable towelettes and masks. The towelettes and masks clog wastewater pumps and screens, driving up costs. "That's what's been killing our grinder pumps," Beavers said. "A new screen cost \$100,000."

"Nothing needs to go down the toilet that's not toilet paper or waste," Smith said. The board is considering paid advertisements to publicize the problem.

Taking up another pandemic issue, the board agreed to allow University researchers to test wastewater for presence of the virus. Beavers noted EPA tests showed the virus is not transported by water or wastewater. The purpose of the testing would be to determine viral load trends once the students return. SUD will require a release from liability and notification when the testing will take place.

Housing is still a priority and we are in discussions with our developer, BP Construction, identifying some possibilities. The construction of the new bookstore is ever so close to completion. 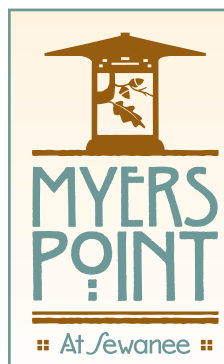
Pets of the Week

NATURENOTES

Last night, May 21, the planets Mercury and Venus made their closest approach in the evening sky, coming to within one degree of each other. They will still be close together tonight, Friday, which is also the date of the new moon. The following night, the moon will be at thin crescent low in the sky shortly after sunset, with Venus above it and Mercury a little higher still. Unfortunately, it looks like it will be cloudy for us in Sewanee all those nights.

Venus is the brightest object in our Solar System (as seen from Earth!) after the Sun and the Moon. It has been called both the Morning Star and the Evening Star. Ancient civilizations thought these were two different bodies and gave them separate names, but Pythagoras realized that they were the same body. It will remain the Evening Star through this month of May, then after a short interval of weeks, will reappear as the Morning Star around sunrise. The Evening and Morning Star terms are now sometimes used for other planets that appear around those times and locations.

The yellowwood in front of the Hospitality Shop has been in magnificent bloom. **Jim Poteet** writes, "This particular tree did not bloom last year, but did the year before. Sporadic blooming is characteristic of the Yellowwood. (Trivia: this is the Tennessee State Bi-Centennial Tree.) Listed as rare in the wild, but frequently planted as an ornamental. The woods between the Monteagle Assembly and old Highway 41, along the old Stagecoach Road, have lots of specimens, but in a 5-year period of Trails and Trillium hikes, we only had one year of widespread blooming."

Reports of Rose-breasted Grosbeaks were still coming in as of a week ago. They are migrating through from their winter range in Mexico and northern South America to their summer range in the Appalachians and from Southern Canada to the central U.S.

Members of the Nature Journaling group have been reporting late daffodils on May 15 and would be interested to know if others have had even later daffodils. Please send any reports to Nature Notes via <ygottfri@sewanee.edu>.



Freddy Tucker of Sewanee and **Deral Walker** of Alto have reported that the hummingbird population they usually see is much smaller this year so far.

Freddy has seen one female and two males, and Deral says she saw one female about three weeks ago, and one male who is now coming to the feeder when he gets tired of the honeysuckle which is blooming in her yard. Park Status Update: Know Before You Go

Camping

SCSP Manager George Shinn announced on May 12 that camping is now open in the park, at 50-percent capacity. The park will maintain half capacity at each campground, to allow for social distancing and limit impact on the park.

Playgrounds, Picnic Areas

Also, SCSP playgrounds and picnic areas are open but, although cleaned daily, are not able to be cleaned to CDC standards. "The public should be diligent in personal cleanliness and use discretion," Manager Shinn said.

Shelters and Group Sites

Gatherings of 10 or more are still not allowed, and shelters and group sites remain closed until Governor Lee lifts that ban. "We are letting small families or individuals utilize the shelter for meals and relaxing out of the sun, but no large gatherings, reunions, etc." Manager Shinn said.

Ranger-Led Programs

"Rangers will also begin offering programming to small groups, by reservation only, with reservations made through the Park's website, in June.

Please be aware that visitors to the park have encountered record-setting crowds over the last few weekends, so please practice appropriate social distancing. Most heavy traffic has been at Denny, Foster, Grundy Forest, Greeter, Stone Door and Collins trail heads. Also, the barely-used Sewanee Natural Bridge parking lot had 40 motorcycles in the parking lot at one point and has been experiencing heavy traffic on nice weather days.


