

## School Board Looks at 2012–13 Budget Demands

**Approves Hiring First-Grade Teacher for SES;  
Continues Review of Personnel Policies**

The Franklin County school board met in a regular board meeting on Aug. 13. The consent agenda was approved, which included early dismissals, surplus properties, the extended contract proposal and teaching positions.

Money has not been allocated in the 2012–13 school budget for the hiring of new teachers since personnel needs were “anticipated in early March to be appropriately included for the proposed 2012–13 budget,” according to Rebecca Sharber, director of schools.

“Diligent efforts have been made to receive a ‘true count’ of student enrollment at each school and in every grade. The student enrollment will be monitored very closely for several days to ensure that the staffing [of teachers] is appropriate,” Sharber said. Job openings as of Aug. 8 included certified (professional license required) teachers with work sites to be determined.

As of Aug. 14, Sewanee Elementary was given approval to hire a new first-grade teacher, according to fifth district school board member Chris McDonough. There are 26 children in first grade at SES, which is over the state maximum class size requirement.

The director’s report included the July 2012 financial report, which is the beginning of the new fiscal year. Revenue for the month was \$35,069. Expenditures for the month totaled \$1,406,852. The school board anticipates revenue for the 2012–13 school year to be \$42,064,062. Proposed expenditures are \$44,258,275.

“The increase in the sewer rate [by Winchester Utilities] is not reflected in our budget,” said Kevin Caroland, second district school board member. “We need to bring to the attention of the public that sometimes expenditures are out of our control.” It is estimated there will be a 150–200 percent increase in sewer costs for schools located on the Winchester sewer service, or approximately \$60,000 more in expenditures.

In new business, the board approved the school board policy 5.200, separation practices for tenured teachers and policy 5.201, separation practices for non-tenured teachers on first and second readings.

Changes to the policies include, “The director of schools may suspend a tenured teacher at any time that may seem necessary pending an investigation of final disposition of a case before the board or an appeal.”

Other changes in the policy include this language: “If an employee is arrested for an unlawful activity, that employee will be suspended with pay only after he/she has had a right to respond, whereupon the director may choose to suspend the employee without pay pending further investigation. If the employee is exonerated in the criminal courts, the director may still discipline the employee if the director believes there is/was misbehavior involved that was too closely connected with the employee’s duties as a teacher.”

The school board will have its next regular business meeting at 6:30 p.m., Tuesday, Sept. 4, at the Franklin County Board of Education. This is a change in the schedule due to the Labor Day holiday. There will not be a work session for that month.

## University Welcomes Students

The University of the South has begun welcoming new seminary students and will welcome the College Class of 2016 beginning on Wednesday, Aug. 22.

Approximately 454 freshmen will be matriculating, Sewanee’s largest class ever. The Class of 2016 includes 24 Eagle Scouts and three Gold Award recipients, 43 first-generation college students, six National Merit semi-finalists and four students from Sewanee. Fourteen of the incoming students are already familiar with campus—they participated in the Sewanee Environmental Institute, the Bridge Program or the Sewanee Summer Music Festival.

The “PRE” pre-orientation begins Aug. 22; the orientation program begins Aug. 25 and will serve to acquaint all new students with the school’s programs, services, and faculty and staff.

The School of Theology’s orientation began with the annual pilgrimage to Hayneville, Ala., on Aug. 11, commemorating Jonathan Daniels, an Episcopal seminarian who was killed for his work in the civil rights movement. Students, faculty and members of the Sewanee community spent the day learning about the seminary’s commitment to social justice.

Twenty-eight new students began their introduction to the school on Aug. 13 with an opening Eucharist and welcome by the Rt. Rev. Neil Alexander, dean of the School of Theology. Two international students are attending this year: Lewis Connolly from Wescott House, Oxford, England, and Emmanuel Petro from Msalato Theological College, St. John’s University of Tanzania. Petro’s presence was made possible by the Flowers Scholarship.

## Heitzenrater completes “Race Across the Sky”

After nearly 12 hours of riding in extreme conditions, Jeff Heitzenrater of Sewanee pedaled across the finish line to complete the Leadville Trail 100 MTB Race in Leadville, Colo.

Heitzenrater, fighting cramps for the last 60 miles of the race, completed the course in 11:47:49 to collect the coveted silver belt buckle, the trophy presented to all finishers.

“I feel very fortunate to have finished the Leadville 100 mile mountain bike race,” said Heitzenrater. “The months of training were difficult and prepared me to race, but the race seemed harder than all of the training put together. My legs started cramping at mile 40, but I still made all of the mid-race time cutoffs by over 45 minutes. That kept my pace fast enough to finish in under 12 hours.”

Heitzenrater is the head coach for the University’s cross country and track and field teams.

The Leadville Trail 100 MTB Race, first run in 1994, is one of the best-known marathon mountain bike races in the country. The 100-mile course travels through the high-altitude, extreme terrain of the Colorado Rockies. The race begins and ends in downtown Leadville, Colo., at 10,152 feet above sea level. Reaching a maximum elevation of 12,424, the course includes a tortuous 3,000-foot climb between miles 40 and 50.

“The last 60 miles were spent trying to go fast enough to make the time cutoffs, but steady enough to keep my legs from locking up,” said Heitzenrater. “When I reached the top of the last climb with 10 miles to go, a race official yelled, ‘You can make the finish in under 12 hours, but you have to hustle.’ All of the hard work paid off when I crossed the finish line under the final cutoff time.”

The 2012 race was Heitzenrater’s second attempt to complete the 100-mile course. In the 2010 race, mechanical difficulties prevented him from making the required cutoff time.

“I have to thank my family for their assistance and encouragement at the aid stations and in the time leading up to the race,” said Heitzenrater. “I could not have done this without their support. In addition, thanks to the guys at Woody’s Bicycles who prepared my bike for the race as I experienced no mechanical issues this year.”

Providing race and moral support, Team Heitzenrater included his wife, Kim, sons Andrew and Larson, as well as his sister, Julie Heitzenrater-Duval, and her family (husband, Derek, and children, Katie and Kyle Duval).

“I could have not done this without my biking buddies in the Sewanee area, who helped me log the training miles needed to finish,” said Heitzenrater. “I look forward to some time off the bike until I prepare to head back to Leadville in a few years.”

## Organic Prayer Project Awarded Grant

The Sisters of Saint Mary have been awarded a grant by the Jessie Ball duPont Foundation to support the Organic Prayer Project, a joint effort between the Sisters and the Center for Religion and the Environment at the University.

“We are so pleased that the Jessie Ball duPont Foundation has chosen to support us in this work,” said Sister Julian Hope, sister-in-charge of St. Mary’s. “With the Organic Prayer Project, we hope to widen our involvement with, and service to, our community and the wider world, while providing a solid financial structure for the convent.”

The grant provides funding over a two-year period for a commercial kitchen for canning vegetables and fruit, a goat-sheep-alpaca farm providing fleece, a contemplative garden, water systems and a nature trail. Future plans include

Benedictine retreats based around the garden, as well as sale of wool and value-added food products from the convent gardens and kitchen. In addition, the project is laying the groundwork to become one of 25 partner sites in the U.S. for the Episcopal Service Corps. This will provide Sewanee graduates an opportunity to participate in a bridge year of service work and personal development.

“This is a wonderful opportunity to display how a collaborative effort of community partners and the University can bring to life the wonderful richness of the space and place of Sewanee, through a new agrarian response to religion and the environment,” said Michael Trent Thompson, director of the Organic Prayer Project. Robin Gottfried is director of the Center for Religion and Environment at the University.

## OBAMA IN THE NEXT TERM To the Editor:

When Barack Obama ran for president in 2008, he had been a U. S. senator not quite four years. As senator, he chaired the Foreign Relations Subcommittee on European Affairs. His senate record stands among the most liberal.

In his first session (109th Congress), he was involved in immigration reform. Legislation bearing his name was passed for armament reduction

and federal transparency, as well as relief aid. In the first year of the 110th Congress, he worked on campaign finance reform, election reform, climate control and troop reduction. In the second year, he legislated for oversight of certain military discharges, Iran divestment and nuclear terrorism reduction. George Bush vetoed his legislation for a state Children's Health Insurance Program and related military family job protections.

Obama was elected president, bringing with him hopes and dreams he had acted on in the senate. But his election followed entrenched Republican congressional rule since 1994 (except for 2007–11) and eight years of Bush-Cheney policies culminating in two wars and world economic disaster. The aftermath of such Republican domination will deeply affect the country and the world for generations.

Obama is a patient consensus builder. He has learned that Republicans are not. Obama worked hard to cooperate with Republicans, receiving nothing for his efforts.

In a second term we can expect him, having learned the limits of patience, to act more quickly and determinedly out of core beliefs. Such actions will include perhaps naming three Supreme Court Justices.

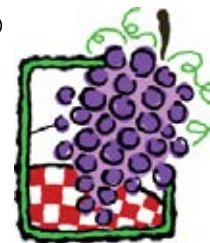

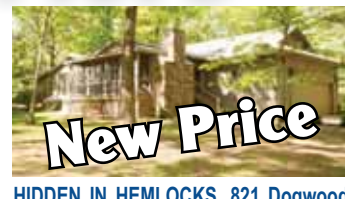

I decided to remodel our kitchen this week. It always takes me a little while to work up the courage to begin a new and (what seems to me) giant undertaking. Her stride is still fresh, and she looks like shiny ceramic tile gliding down the beach. My gait speaks of plantar fasciitis and is clearly screaming for a remodel job. I have watched my girls struggle in sports and also be rewarded for their persistence. Scoreboards, teammates, coaches, sweaty socks and wild runs around the base paths have shaped their view of the world. We sat in that kitchen after most ballgames while devouring dinner and dissecting post-game strategy. Cabinet-stain colors and countertops hardly mattered. Their red faces were our checkerboard tiles, and a father didn't really need to speak while five women recounted the events of the day.

My oldest daughter, Avery, heads to Spain this week to study for a semester abroad, as she begins her junior year of college. Sadie is leaving for college on Sept. 3. Someone took a wood chisel to those quickly passing game-night dinners and remodeled my life. Don't get me wrong: I couldn't be happier. I couldn't be prouder. But I am going to lie if I tell you that a piece of Sheetrock isn't getting ripped out of my chest watching them make their way into their own shiny new kitchens of this world. I am ever grateful they chose an activity they didn't mind sharing with their dad. And I am thankful that Conchie was wise enough to know that two just wouldn't be enough.

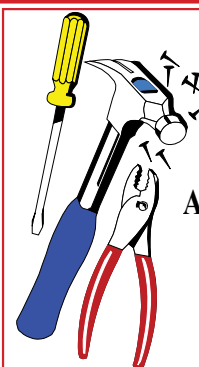

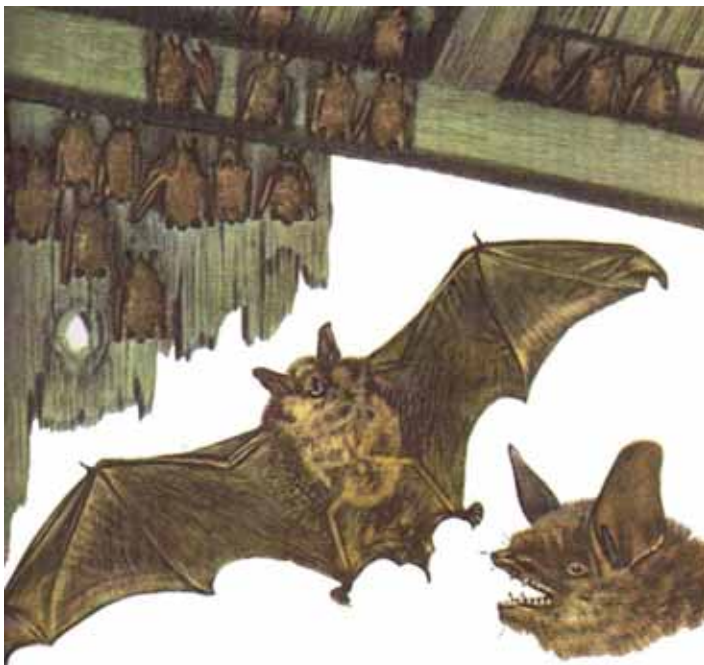

### Local Shed is Bat Hangout

Harry and Jean Yeatman consider themselves lucky to have a small bat colony in their storage shed.

Bats are the only flying mammals. Their forelimbs are greatly modified and form wings very different from those of birds. In bats the fingers are greatly lengthened to support a thin membrane. This membrane extends to the hind legs. The legs and usually the tail support the membrane.

Bats have limited eyesight, so in flight their large ears form part of a unique system for locating and avoiding objects. Bats emit a high-pitched sound which echoes back like a radar beam, which is picked up by the bat's sensitive ears. This allows them to avoid objects and also pick up flying insects for food.

There are about 65 kinds of bats found in the United States and these are primarily insect-eaters. "This is why we are so glad to have them on our farm, hanging from the rafters of the shed. It is fun to watch them come out in the evening and fly about over the pasture in search of food," Jean commented.

"We have seen three kinds of bats: Pipestrels, which are about three inches long and have reddish-brown fur; Little Brown Bats, which are about three-and-a-half inches long, and Big-eared Bats, which can be as large as four inches long, with very reddish fur.

"Bats are harmless," she continued, "but some can carry rabies, so I keep our cats up-to-date on rabies shots, just in case a sick bat falls to the ground, and a cat tries to play with it."

## Tennessee Trails Meeting Features Duck River

The Nature Conservancy's Duck River Program will be featured at the Tennessee Trails Association meeting at 7 p.m., Monday, Aug. 27, at the D. W. Wilson Community Center in Tullahoma.

The Duck River rises up in eastern Coffee County and flows for 272 miles across Middle Tennessee to Kentucky Lake and the Tennessee River. A part of the Tennessee-Cumberland river basin, the Duck is the longest river wholly contained within the state and is free-flowing for most of its length. The river has a multitude of values—it is the water supply for nearly 250,000 people, is an excellent fishery and a popular recreation destination.

Widely considered the most biologically diverse river in North America, the Duck River is home to over 650 different river species. This rich array of life includes 151 species of fish, 55 species of freshwater mussels and 22 freshwater snail species.

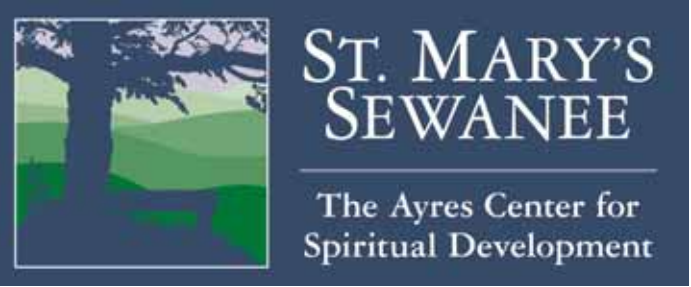
